Discussion

- 1- It has been observed that all schools have a Physical education teacher.
- 2- All the schools have qualified physical education teachers.
- 3- It has been observed that 26 physical education teachers have the support of other staff members for organizing various sports events while 4 physical education teachers do not have the support of other staff members for organizing various sports events.
- 4- The study shows that 27 schools have updated sports equipment and 3 schools do not have updated sports equipment.
- 5- The study shows that 17 physical education teachers have completed an orientation program for their knowledge upgrade. While 13 physical education teachers do not have a complete orientation program for his knowledge upgradation
- 6- The study shows that 28 schools have parents' support for the student's participation in sports and physical

education activities and 2 schools do not have the parent's support for the student's participation in sports and physical education activities.

7- It has been observed that 7 schools were forced to teach another subject to physical education teachers while 23 schools were not forced to teach another subject.

8- It is concluded that 29 physical education teachers implemented their skills for the overall development of students while 1 physical education teacher did not implement his skills for the overall development of students.

9- It has been observed that 23 schools' management involved the physical education teacher in specific duties related to curriculum planning and implementation while 7 schools' management did not involve the physical education teacher in specific duties related to curriculum planning and implementation.

10- It has been concluded that 15 physical education teachers prepared the health records to analyze and promote a healthy and active lifestyle for your students while the rest of the 15 physical education teachers did not prepare the health records to analyze and promote a healthy and active lifestyle for your students.

11-Study shows that 29 schools of physical education teachers used safety measures during physical activities while 1 school of physical education teachers did not use safety measures during physical activities.

12- It has been observed that 23 physical education teachers collaborate with other faculty members and 7 physical education teachers did not collaborate with other faculty members for a cumulative growth of the school.

13- It has been observed that 29 physical education teachers have set their professional ethics for fostering teamwork, leadership, and sportsmanship while 1 physical education teacher did not have set his professional ethics for fostering teamwork, leadership, and sportsmanship.

14- It has been concluded that 28 physical education teachers have planned activities to accommodate students with different fitness levels and abilities and 2 physical education teachers did not have planned activities to accommodate students with different fitness levels and abilities.

15-It had been observed that 28 physical education teachers had plans for organizing and overseeing sports events and competitions while 2 physical education teachers did not have plans for organizing and overseeing sports events and competitions.

16- It had been observed that all the physical education teachers have contributed to promoting a positive and inclusive learning environment in his school.

17- A study shows that 8 physical education teachers have planned special activities for disabled students while 22 physical education teachers do not have planned special activities for disabled students.

18- A study shows that 29 physical education teachers help their students to resolve behavioural issues or conflicts during classes while 1 physical education teachers help do not have his students resolve behavioural issues or conflicts during classes.

19- It has been observed that 29 physical education teachers are updated on the latest trends and research in the field of physical education while 1 physical education teacher was not updated on the latest trends and research in the field of physical education.

20- It has been observed that all the physical education teachers contribute to school cultural and community engagement programs.

21- It has been observed that 29 physical education teachers help the students with their individual needs and challenges and 1 physical education teacher did not help the students with their individual needs and challenges.

22- It has been observed that all the physical education teachers plan strategies to students participate actively in sports.

23- A study shows that 18 physical education teachers collaborate with local sports clubs and associations for organizing affiliated sports championships while 12 physical education teachers do not collaborate with local sports clubs and associations for organizing affiliated sports championships.

24- It has been observed that all the physical education teachers work to create a passion for lifelong participation in physical activities in the students.

25- It has been observed that 29 physical education teachers were capable of resolving disciplinary issues during physical education classes or sports events while 1 physical education teacher was not capable of resolving the disciplinary issues during physical education classes or sports events.

26- It has been observed that 29 physical education teachers never rendered their services for the government election process while 1 physical education teacher did not have ever rendered his services for the government election process.

27- A study shows that 19 physical education teachers think that these services will deviate you from your coaching and teaching which usually results in a detonation in students' performance while 11 physical education teachers did not think that these services will deviate you from your coaching and teaching which usually results in detonation in students' performance.

28- The study shows that 29 physical education teachers prepared a structured analysis to assess the physical fitness levels and progress of the students while 1 physical education teacher did not prepare a structured analysis to assess the physical fitness levels and progress of the students.

Conclusion

The study's findings on the role and contribution of physical education personnel in schools highlight a strong foundation of qualified physical education teachers but also reveal several critical areas for improvement. All schools employ qualified physical education teachers, who play an integral role in promoting physical activity, teamwork, and healthy lifestyles among students. Furthermore, the majority of physical education teachers actively support the organization of sports events, collaborate with faculty members, implement professional ethics, and plan activities that accommodate students of varying fitness levels and abilities.

However, significant gaps were identified in areas such as the inclusion of disabled students in physical activities, orientation programs for knowledge upgrades, and collaboration with local sports clubs and associations for organizing sports championships. The findings also reveal that several physical education teachers were required to teach subjects outside their specialty, which could detract from their ability to focus on sports development.

The absence of orientation programs for professional development for some teachers, the lack of administrative support in curriculum planning, and limited health record maintenance also present challenges. Furthermore, a majority of physical education teachers view participation in non-teaching activities, such as election duties, as detrimental to their core responsibilities, believing it affects their coaching quality and student performance.

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
